

THIS SEASON 2007-2008 (Players Partnership & Position Development) PPPD

The emphasis this year for the U7s will be on developing partnerships and support play , moving forward as a team ie taking the tackle / tag but still going forward . Whilst developing a better understanding of how to defend , with a sense of responsibility for the positional areas best suited to the players.

- *The U7s have always been very good in attack & going forward , this is due to the outstanding coaching from all parties involved & we want to be encouraging this throughout the season .However our defending let us down last year & we were caught out flat footed a quite a few times .*
- *In essence we will be letting the children control the game with a set game plan , giving them responsibility for partnership playing , hopefully giving us the advantage .*
- *New parents may think the children may be to young to understand this type of game plan , however year on year the children have surprised with levels of understanding , commitment & and how fast the children pick up the game when they are enjoying themselves .*
- *So if we start this season knowing what we want and where we want to be , I believe we have a very good chance of winning some serious silver this year .*

Tournaments:

- *Your child must be 6 years of age on the day of the tournament to play .*
- *Each child chosen to play in will be required to pay a tournament fee of £ 2.50 on the day.*
- *We are normally only permitted to take 12 players to a tournament, however if I feel we have a good enough second team , then we forwarding a Farnborough A & B teams .*
- *Choosing the players for tournaments will done at the end of the previous weeks training session , in conjunction with the coaches and myself , however the last word will be with me .*
